The following Federation Bylaws Amendment was submitted for membership voting:

1. Title: To change the Federation Conference from annual to biennial

(63)

2. Currently Federation Bylaw Article XI, Section 1. states "The Federation shall hold an annual conference. The purpose of the conference shall be to report on legislative activities, member recruitment, Alzheimer's and NARFE PAC efforts, training as needed, networking and to report results of biennial Federation elections and appointments, as well as, voting results on resolutions and amendments to the Federation or National Bylaws and Rules, as applicable, and for installation of officers"

3. Specifically I propose The MO Federation Conference hold biennial state conferences in the year of an election only and that in the off-year hold only an annual meeting via electronic format.

4. If approved the Federation Bylaw, Article XI, Section 1 would state: "The Federation shall hold a biennial conference in the year of an election and hold an annual meeting in the off-year via electronic format. The purpose of the conference shall be to report on legislative activities, member recruitment, Alzheimer's and NARFE PAC efforts, training as needed, networking and to report results of biennial Federation elections and appointments, as well as, voting results on resolutions and amendments to the Federation or National Bylaws and Rules, as applicable, and for installation of officers."

5. The reason for the change is with the reduction of chapters, the commitment of a host chapter is becoming increasingly hard to find.

- 6. Estimated cost: None, as it would save money.

The Federation Bylaws and Resolutions Committee reviewed the proposal to ensure that it violates no National Bylaws and, if approved, would require these changes in other sections of Federation Bylaws as follows:

Article VII: The Executive Board, Section 3. Duties "The Executive Board shall have general supervision of the affairs of the Federation between (annual conferences) an annual meeting or biennial conference.

Article XI: The Federation Conference: Section 3. Annual Report: "The Federation Secretary shall prepare an annual report immediately following the close of the Federation Conference(.) or annual meeting. This report shall cover the actions taken at the Conference(.) or annual meeting. It shall be distributed to the Region Vice President, and to the headquarters of the National Active and Retired Federal Employees (NARFE) Association.

Minutes of the Federation Conference or annual meeting shall be distributed to all NARFE Association members via the Federation newsletter and website."



Recruit New NARFE Members to Keep NARFE Strong

Greetings to all my fellow NARFE members. Hope this finds you all well. NARFE has been in existence for the last 100 years from 1921-2021 with the sole purpose of protecting the pay and

benefits of all federal employees. This alone should be enough to get all federal employees to join, but it is a continuing problem for us to get the younger employees to join and contribute to the continued success of NARFE. As we are continuing to lose our older members, it is imperative we recruit younger prospects to keep NARFE strong as a viable organization to confront Congress on behalf of our members. There is no other organization like NARFE dedicated solely to protecting federal employees. I'm asking each one of you to do your part and recruit at least one new member this year. Your state board is helping you to get our message out and recruit new members by paying the first-year dues for any new member recruited. Just since my last article in July, we have decreased in membership by 43 members. Let's all pitch in and help out with the recruitment of new members. Thank you all in advance for your help.

We had our presidents' meeting in conjunction with the national conference. It was to be held in San Antonio, Texas, and many of us were planning on attending in-person; but about a week before it was to happen, NARFE National President Ken Thomas decided that because of the Covid virus spreading again with Texas being a hot spot, to cancel the in-person meeting and make it virtual. We were presented with a lot of new information about NARFE, from the new branding, marketing strategies, improving our magazine, the centennial celebration (going on all year), to a new website to be launched this fall called FedHub (where you will be able to communicate with other federal employees who may have the same problems or concerns as you). Also covered were Advocacy with the new 117th Congress for legislative priorities, which includes repeal of the WEP/GPO, pay raises for federal employees, and postal reform. NARFE was successful in getting Congress to pass the Government Employees Fairness Act, which will insure federal employees are paid whenever there is a government shutdown without any further legislation needed.

We were told that the national office is working to correct the AMS problems that members are reporting such as not being able to access and use the NES (National Email System) message system for the national only members, and problems correcting member information in the system. This is something that needs to be fixed to give us the access as we need it. Hopefully soon!!

When talking to new member prospects, remember to let them know all that NARFE stands for and what we have to offer. Let them know about the monthly magazine and especially about the webinars NARFE offers. For the price of one webinar, you get your membership and all its benefits. Also worth noting is the federal experts that NARFE has dealing with Retirement, TSP, Medicare, and Health Insurance. These experts have vast knowledge of federal benefits and retirement and are available to all our members.

Our legislative priorities include Postal Reform, GPO/ WEP, and COLAs. On postal reform we have HR. 3076 and S.1720, which would create a new risk pool in the FEHB plans and would have postal employees in a separate risk pool from other federal employees. That could lead to an increase in premiums. Ask your congressional representatives to withhold support until an analysis on changes to FEHB plans can be completed. NARFE would also like to see that postal retirees have a choice on Medicare Part B, and not be forced to enroll in it. The GPO/ WEP HR. 82 and S.1302 - The Social Security Fairness Act - would completely repeal the GPO/WEP provisions. Once again, I believe Congress is dragging its feet hoping that all the CSRS - civil service retirees - pass away making this a moot point. Pretty sad, isn't it!! There are two COLA bills: HR. 4315 would change the index used to figure COLAs from the CPI-W to the CPI-E which more closely and accurately estimates the spending of seniors. HR. 304 -Equal COLA Act - would allow FERS retirees to receive the same COLA as the CSRS retirees.

In closing, I would like to ask you all to become more involved with NARFE by recruiting new members, becoming more active in your chapters and state board, and finally by contacting your congressional representatives as needed on these legislative issues I have presented you. We all need to have our voices heard to make sure Congress not only hears our concerns, but acts on them appropriately. Thank you and stay safe and healthy until we meet again.

The pandemic of 2020 has carried into 2021 with more force than we had hoped. I know everyone in the world was hoping and counting on a better outcome in 2021. Just for information's sake, I looked up the numbers since the

original outbreak in early December 2019: on May 13, 2020 there were over 292,000 deaths in 187 countries and territories. As of September 19, 2021 the USA has reported 6,915,620 deaths with a 1.6% death percentage. Region V has a total of 37,241 deaths attributed to the COVID-19 virus. She expressed that as the organization loses members, most of whom are retired, it will be imperative for future members to reinvent NARFE to fit in with their needs and lifestyles so that the basic purpose of advocating for federal salaries and benefits and the benefits of retired employees is not lost. A discussion continued about how to make meetings convenient for both working members and retired members.

2nd VP/Immediate Past President/Membership Chair/ FEEA Coordinator Laura Cowart's report was previously distributed. She had no further comment to augment her report.

All District Leaders submitted a quarterly report. See the newsletter for details.

1st CDL Craig Pettibone commented on Cori Bush's focus on communicating with constituents and attending to the needs of those in her district.

2nd CDL Linda Kurz stated that she is revising her report to include a correction about chapter (2071) secretary Mary Ann Wehrle's presentation on Covid-19. She is also correcting her report with regard to COLA data.

3rd CDL Stephen Price commented that he receives only form letters from his district representative after he communicates with him. Stephen received word from Mary Ann Stegeman, President of Chapter 313-Jefferson City requesting to close the chapter. Discussion of closing chapters emphasized that the decision to close lies with the members not the leadership. Stephen also spoke about an old bill in the State House that would affect taxes on federal retirees' income.

6th CDL Joseph Manno informed the board that all of the chapters in his district have been meeting in-person with the exception of Chapter 2256-Kansas City North. It appears that this chapter is headed for closure. Since the passing of the secretary in Chapter 1915-No. Central, Joe has assumed that office.

7th CDL Paul Mosbaugh reported that the November meeting for Chapter 19-Joplin would take on the feeling of a social club. Officers of Chapter 1437-Branson are seeking advice about what to do with their paper records should they close.

8th (Interim) CDL Walter Cowart stated that he has been unable to attend any chapter meetings in the district. He is looking for someone in Chapter 2283-Ava to take on the position of CDL for the district since he is not a resident of the 8th District.

State Legislative Chair Stephen Price's report was previously distributed. He commented that the Federation might have to revise its district/chapter alignments depending on how the state is redistricted based on the 2020 census

NARFE-PAC Coordinator Elbert Williams' report was previously distributed. The PAC anticipates disbursing \$1.6 million dollars during the current 2-year cycle. So far, \$407K has been disbursed. There were six disbursements totaling \$9,000 to legislators in four Region V states (KS, MN, NE & SD). Iowa, Missouri and North Dakota has to date not received any PAC funds. \$853K has been contributed to the PAC. There was a short discussion with regard to how contributions taken automatically (either through a credit card or from your annuity) can be managed by the contributor.

Newsletter Editor Mary Lamping advised the board that a new contract with the newsletter publisher was signed. The term for the renewal is four years. There is an opt out clause giving either party a 30-day notice to terminate the contract.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

1- Conference Bank Account - Marcy stated that she needed to do further research into this issue. The board will address this issue after next year's conference.

2- General Consent for Voting - Gary cited a July email to the board from Region V VP Cindy Reneé Blythe that the secretary must receive responses from board members when voting on motions taken without a meeting. All future voting issues without a meeting will abide by this directive; the Secretary to track the votes, then report back to the board of the results.

3- Publication of Newsletter – Mary reminded the board that there remain a number of federation members who do not use computers and therefore the printed newsletter may be their only connection with NARFE. There is no cost to the Federation to print the paper because the publisher covers his costs through ad revenue.

NEW BUSINESS

1- Federation Conference 2022 Update - Laura reported that the Conference Committee is still on target and will meet in January to firm up details. A rough draft of the (See Board, page 16)

agenda has already been prepared. The board agreed that the conference should include a speaker from NARFE's Advocacy Committee. The board also agreed that a conference speaker be added to the agenda to address credit reporting-how to get a report and how to file a claim with a credit reporting company if an error is cited on your report.

Gary moved to hold the next board meeting (January 27) at the Oasis Hotel in Springfield. An amendment to the original motion was made to have the meeting as a hybrid (in-person and via Zoom) for those who might not be able to travel. After a short discussion, the amendment was seconded and passed. Thereafter, the original motion was seconded and passed.

2- CAB - Laura, the Region V Configuration Advisory Board (CAB) representative encouraged feedback on the newly launched FEDHUB, NARFE's social media. She informed the board that the National staff is back at the office three days a week. There continues to be issues with the AMS (membership database) including assigning Position Codes for federation and chapter officers. National sees a clear need for an in-house IT/database manager. The board discussed the ongoing problems with the NES (email system). Discussion continued about the problems (e.g. adding information to the database by authorized officers) of the AMS not only by the Missouri federation and but by other Region V federations.

A Motion came to the floor to include in the quarterly newsletter for Laura to pen an article about CAB. The motion was seconded and passed.

3- 2022 Elections - Gary brought up several questions about the forthcoming election. President Kretzer is to appoint two committees - a Nominating Committee and a Teller Committee. Sherry volunteered to head the Nominating Committee. She will seek out candidates for open board positions. Emerson will contact Michele and Lois to serve on the Teller Committee. (Post meeting, both

Michele and Lois accepted their assignments). The Teller Committee receives and counts votes for those running for office. The board also discussed a proposed resolution to change annual conferences to biennial conferences. As everyone is keenly aware, the current pandemic has made it almost impossible for us to meet in person, especially with our members being mostly in highrisk populations. Vaccines are now widely available, but the 70 - 80% vaccinated target that the medical experts think is necessary is a long way off. Chapters are encouraged to continue with whatever communications are possible, and some do send out newsletters or emails when they can.

The status of Chapter 991 in Washington is pretty much the same; the closure of the chapter is progressing. Again, it is my understanding that all of the Chapter members have chosen to be transferred to the State Chapter.

Missouri Provides Steady Stream of NARFE-PAC Contributions

We have completed three quarters of the two-year 2021-22 congressional PAC cycle. Missouri continues providing a steady stream of PAC contributions, but there is still no reported atten-

dance to legislators' fundraisers nor PAC disbursements in Missouri.

As of Sep 30, for the 3-quarter grand total, \$852,650 has been contributed to NARFE-PAC by 16,796 members nationwide. This includes \$332,409 from 7,318 national-only members who are not associated with a chapter, \$105 from four "international" members not residing in the states, and \$18,500 from 483 "other" members. Within Region V, at the end of the quarter, \$53,608 has been contributed by 895 members.

The total Missouri contribution was \$12,767 from 193 members. The total disbursement during just the third quarter, Jul thru Sep, was \$121,000. The disbursements included \$101,500 to 76 legislators and \$20,000

to nine Leadership PACs. Within Region V, there were six separate disbursements totaling \$9000 to legislators from four Region V states (Kansas, Minnesota, Nebraska, South Dakota). Iowa, Missouri and North Dakota legislators have not yet received any PAC money this cycle. Missouri members are encouraged to be on the alert for local fundraising events and to contact me or Ross Apter

at NARFE headquarters with the details.

NARFE-PAC contributions have remained strong for the first three quarters, but both contributions and disbursements are a bit below the third quarter totals for 2019-20.A continued strong level of support is required to ensure that we reach the NARFE-PAC 2021-22 contribution/disbursement goals.

Meetings With Congressional Representative and Senators' Staff



CRAIG PETTIBONE District 1 CDL

Following MO-1's Representative Cori Bush. As NARFE's designated contact with our MO-1 Congressional Representative, I find Rep. Cori Bush to be a very energetic Member of Congress. I see her on her official website

(bush.house.gov), on Facebook (www.facebook.com/ RepCori), and on Twitter (twitter.com/coribush). I receive emails from her, almost daily. She is working hard to represent her constituents in MO-1 and demonstrates a keen interest in those constituents struggling to make ends meet. She worked hard to keep the federal housing moratorium and rental assistance programs in place. She worked closely with St. Louis County and City officials to ensure that her constituents had access to these programs. She holds monthly live internet video townhalls to let her constituents know how she is working to serve them. I have accepted invitations to join in some of these townhalls.

Rep. Bush Partners with local libraries. Rep. Bush recently announced a partnership with libraries in St. Louis County and city to help residents access various government services. Bush's constituent services team is operating the neighborhood service centers at two county branches and two city branches as part of the "Congress in Your Neighborhood" program. The service centers are scheduled to run through the end of 2021 and will help residents navigate federal agencies and tax resources; secure passports; and handle immigration casework, military service academy nominations and other local issues.

Meeting with Rep. Cori Bush's Staff. As a part of the June 23 Advocacy Day at LegCon21, I and MONARFE members Sherry Haskins (C 2071) and Patricia Barrett (C 1843) met virtually with Rep. Cori Bush's Legislative Assistant in Washington, DC, Saul Levin. We were able to discuss Repeal or Reform of the WEP/GPO, Securing More Accurate Cost-of-Living Adjustments (COLAs) for Seniors, and Protecting the Federal Employees Health Benefits (FEHB) Program from the threat posed by the pending Postal Service Reform Act.

Meetings with Senator Roy Blunt's and Senator Josh Hawley's staff. As a part of August's Grassroots Advocacy Month, I participated in an August 10 meeting in St. Louis with Senator Blunt's Field Representative Jennifer Meyers and an August 12 meeting with Senator Hawley's Field Representative Ben Gruender. Linda Kurz, MONARFE Congressional District Rep for MO-2, arranged these later meetings. C 112 members Mary Lamping and Judith Smart participated in these meetings. We again discussed need for more accurate COLA's, reform of the WEP and GPO, and Postal Reform.

Chapter Activities

As President of Chapter 112, Greater St. Louis Area,

I continued to use Zoom video meeting software to make possible ongoing monthly ongoing meetings with not only C 112 members, but also to reach out to officers of the other St. Louis Area chapters 1240 (Florissant/North St. Louis County), 1278 (Jefferson County), and 2071 (West St. Louis County). Chapter 112 members enjoyed having members of other chapters join us while their chapters were not meeting during the ongoing Covid 19 pandemic. As summer ended and fall began, both C 112 and C 2071, were able to resume some in-person meetings. I continue to make C 112-chapter meetings available on Zoom to members of all four St. Louis Area chapters. We recommend that participants at in-person meetings be fully vaccinated for Covid-19 and wear masks except when eating.

NARFE Advocacy and Chapter 2071 Meetings

LINDA KURZ District 2 CDL

AUGUST: I arranged advocacy visits to Senators Blunt and Hawley and to Rep. Ann Wagner of MO District #2. Craig Pettibone, Mary Lamping (both Chapter 112) and I visited the Senators' offices



respectively on Aug 10 and 12. We discussed Postal Reform, fair COLA for retirees and WEP/GPO with staff. Senator Blunt's Field Representative told us that Senator Blunt was working on including vision and dental benefits in Medicare. Mary Lamping and I visited Rep. Ann Wagner's Ballwin office on Aug 25 and discussed the same issues. Our support requests were to be passed on since all legislative matters are handled in Wagner's Washington office.

Our chapter 2071 met in person on August 5, complying with Covid restrictions. We saw media clips about history and construction progress of the new Geospatial Intelligence Western Headquarters on cleared, blighted North city property. Some historic properties were moved to new locations. A skills training partnership was signed with Harris-Stowe University to recruit local residents to cover future Geospatial Intelligence employee needs.

This was also the month when a trillion-dollar bipartisan infrastructure bill was passed by the Senate with 17 Republicans participating and which House Democrats will only approve in tandem with their \$3.5 billion democrat-only FY22 budget bill to be negotiated with the Senate in mid-September. The US exceeded the debt limit at

the end of July; and federal pension funds, Social Security Trust fund and TSP (extraordinary measures) were used to continue government operations. Democrats hoped that the FY22 budget or CR bill would also increase the debt limit.

SEPTEMBER: On September 2, chapter 2071 learned from an ecumenical Christian Ministry for Prisoners. They attract maximum security prisoners to meetings with food, but attendance is voluntary. Prison data show success in reducing violence within the prison through their food-meditations and interactive discussions. They believe those gang leaders, who attend repeatedly, talk other prisoners into attending. Prisoners, it is believed, return to meetings because they get love and caring they've never received

in their lives. They visit both men and women maximum security prisons and hold summer camps for the children of imprisoned parents, who likely also experience no caring by their families. Through repeated camp involvement such children become significantly less likely to become future prisoners themselves.

OCTOBER: Chapter 2071 met on October 7 with 12 members and 3 guests in attendance observing Covid-protective measures. Mary Anne Wehrle, chapter secretary and MRN, told attendees that there is now enough significant research to show that the vaccine is effective in protecting folks and keeping them out of intensive care if reinfected, but a booster will help increase their Covid antibodies for many months to all mutations that are arising. Covid is likely to become endemic like the flu. Research also shows that pregnant women or those who expect pregnancy can impart immunity to their babies and themselves without any ill effects. The flu shot (a dead viral version of current flu virus mutations) and the booster (an mRNA vaccine) can be taken at the same time, suggesting to take one in each arm. Research also has shown that Covid is mainly passed through droplets projected to about 6 ft as we speak and much further if we sneeze. Using one's hand to catch a sneeze and then touching another human can transmit the virus within 24 hours of its vitality on surfaces. Vaccinated people can harbor and pass the Covid virus on to others, therefore it is recommended that all people wear masks and maintain a distance of at least 6ft or more from others in a crowded gathering, even in the stands of a sports stadium. It's a responsible reaction of people who care about others as well as themselves. Conspiracy theories have been debunked, and our responsibility should be clear.

The COLA pay has been formalized at 5.9% for CSRS but only 4.9% for FERS retirees. The federal pay raise will be 2.7% for CSRS and 1.7% for FERS until Congress passes the law to equalize COLA for FERS. FEGLI insurance premiums will change for a first time since 2016. BASIC (required for all feds) will increase by a cent per thousand of coverage as of October 1. Optional versions may increase or decrease, usually for midrange ages, not for younger or older feds.

Mailing a letter now costs \$0.58, a post card \$0.40 as of October 1. Delivery for 31% of first-class packages will be delayed by up to 2 days while 5% will speed delivery by a day. One can order supplies, have packages picked up and tracked on line- this in spite of the Postal Board now including 3 Biden appointees.

Be careful to protect your identity through the IRStheir data is still partially vulnerable to hacking. Do not fall for any scams by phone calls, text messages or emails- they abound.

Although we have a Continuing Resolution and a Debt ceiling agreement until Dec 3rd, we are painfully close to crashing the US economy and cause a global recession because of the stubborn partisanship of both parties. Folks don't seem to understand, nor does the media help in explaining, that the debt ceiling has nothing to do with projected costs but simply pays for the debts we have already incurred and that were created by both parties.


I received a call from Morris Ridge and his wife Ethel
















Branson Shepherd of the Hills Chapter Votes to Shut Down

State MONARFE Report: Joe Manno reported on the


upcoming face-to-face Missouri State Annual conference. The annual conference will be in Springfield on May 4-5, 2022.

How to Apply for the FEEA Tutoring Program

Last year, FEEA introduced a new tutoring program (feea.org/our-programs/tutoring) created to help fill the urgent need many families were facing during national K-12 school disruptions. FEEA is restarting the program now for the 2021-22 school year to continue assisting families during the ongoing pandemic. Through a partnership with Tutor.com, the program provides free, one-on-one, online, on-demand tutoring in all of the most common K-12 academic subjects. Kids can get help when they need it from an experienced tutor.

Due to the popularity of the program and our limited

funding, we have two important changes for the current school year:

1. Annual salary must be less than \$75,000. This applies to the full-time or full-time-equivalent salary of the federal employee parent, including any locality pay.

2. Each participating family will be limited to 1,000 minutes of tutoring (approximately 16 hours total per family). Please note this is a per family limit, regardless of the number of eligible children in the family.

All families wishing to participate -- including those

who registered last year -- must submit an application (feea.org/our-programs/tutoring/tutoring-application). We encourage parents to register early so tutoring is available when your family needs it. Application processing can take up to ten business days.

Federal Communication Commission Offers Emergency Broadband Benefit to Help Households Keep Internet Connection During the Pandemic


